Tualatin Together: Working for a Healthy and Drug-Free Community



Tualatin Together is a coalition supporting an engaged community, united for a healthy Tualatin, free

from drug & alcohol abuse. Tualatin Together signed on as a partner for the Tualatin Tomorrow community vision to advance the community action of promoting drug and alcohol awareness and addiction prevention.

In September 2014, Tualatin Together applied for and was awarded a Federal Drug Free Communities Grant. The Award is for \$125,000 a year for 5 years! They are just at the six month mark with the grant and very thankful for the work of the Board of Directors, Sector Representatives and many, many partners within the community including Tualatin Tomorrow.

Other than monthly coalition meetings where you will hear report outs from workgroups along with education on some of the latest in drug trends, Tualatin Together also offers education opportunities. The Community Education Workgroup is focused on bringing talking points and creating conversation where parents and youth already are.

This spring a series of "Coffee Talks" in various places with experts will be offered. Look for them at Starbuck's on late start Wednesday's and other times and places too! Tualatin Together is also working on ways to engage parents and youth to have conversations around knowing what drugs are out there and keeping open lines of communication around them.

Youth are our future. StandUP Tualatin is a Club at Tualatin High School. There is an effort to start groups similar to it at Hazelbrook and potentially at each of the elementary schools that feed into Tualatin High School.

Reminder - Residential Backflow Device Test Reports Due June 1

Residential properties with any of the following items are required to have an approved backflow prevention device installed and tested by June 1: (1) inground irrigation system; (2) active well; (3) in-ground swimming pool/spa; (4) ornamental fountain; (5) fish pond; or (6) solar heating system. The City requires you to submit a passing backflow device test report each year no later than June 1 to avoid receiving a 5-day shut-off notice or interruption of your water service. Give Yourself Plenty of Time to Apply for a Passport



Planning a vacation in another country? Give yourself plenty of time to apply for a Passport.

The City of Tualatin processes passports Monday through Friday, from 8:00 am – 4:00 pm. You may bring your own passport photos or passport photos are available at our offices for \$16 for two 2"x2" photos.

Passports generally take 4–6 weeks. If you have less than six weeks, but at least three weeks, you may pay extra to have your passport expedited. If you have less than three weeks, you will need to make an appointment with the Passport Office in Seattle in order to get your passport processed quickly.

The cost for a passport is: \$110 for adults

(16 and older) and \$80 for children under 16. There is also a \$25 processing fee to the City of Tualatin. The cost for a passport card (good for Canada and Mexico land and some sea travel only) is: \$30 for adults (16 and over), \$15 for children under 16, plus a \$25 processing fee to the City of Tualatin.

Separate payments are needed for the U.S. Department of State and the City of Tualatin. A check or money order is required for the U.S. Department of State. Please bring the following when you apply: your unsigned Passport Application form, original birth certificate or certified copy of your birth certificate, two recent 2x2 inch passport photos, proof of identification and checks or money order for your fees.


