TUALATIN JOB GROWTH – ONE OF THE BEST!

In December 2015 the Milken Institute produced the 2015 Best Performing Cities report (based on job/wage growth & high-tech GDP/exports) for US cities above 50,000 people. The Portland Metro area jumped from 16th highest in 2014 to #8 in 2015.

How does Tualatin fit in this mix? We are one of the best!

For the 5-year period from 2010-2014, Tualatin's job growth rate percentage was the highest in the Portland Metro region. Tualatin's was 19% (3,987 jobs) while the rest of region's communities ranged from 9 – 15%.

What's even better is that Tualatin's average wages are trending high as well. For 2014, Tualatin's average wage was \$51,216. While a few other Metro communities are higher (Portland, Hillsboro, and Beaverton) our average wage is still higher than the other Metro area communities.

You can see the outcome of that job growth in all the new industrial construction going on in Tualatin. Developers know the huge demand for space and have invested more than \$60 million dollars in constructing new speculative space – space that is not being constructed for a specific client or company.

With four major projects having recently completed or currently in construction, there will be at least 800,000 square-feet of new speculative space completed in 2016 on the west side of Tualatin from SW 112th to SW 115th to 118th – from south of Tualatin-Sherwood Road north to Herman Road.

ANNUAL HYDRANT FLUSHING

You may have noticed that the City has started its annual process to flush our fire hydrants. On a regular basis, city staff opens fire hydrant valves to allow water to flow through the pipes. Systematically opening the hydrants enhances water quality by flushing sediment from the main line pipes, verifies the proper operation of hydrants and valves, and ensures that the hydrant is operational in case of a fire emergency. During this process, there can be temporary incidences of discoloured water while fine sediment particles are flushed. There are no health hazards associated with the discolored water.
