

Remember...

- △ Stop playing at sunset.
- △ Ensure parked cars are far enough away to avoid damage to vehicles.

Location

A basketball hoop should be located /stored in the driveway or on the planter strip of the property but never in the roadway. Basketball games can be played on residential streets that do not have a bike lane and the speed limit is 25mph.

Driveway

The ideal location for a hoop is in the driveway. If the driveway slopes more than 1 foot and is less than 400 square feet then the hoop can be placed on the driveway apron or the planter strip of the property.

Planter Strip

The planter strip is the strip of land between the sidewalk and the street. Not all properties have this option.

Street

Hoops cannot be kept on the street or sidewalk and the base must not interfere with sidewalk use. Portable hoops can be moved to the roadway edge during a game.



Placement Reminders

- Don't put hoops at an intersection or within 50 feet of one.
- The hoop ring should be at least 10 feet above the roadway and the backboard not extended over the street.
- Do not let hoops interfere with public utilities, road maintenance, street sweeping, catch basins, street trees, mailboxes, garbage service, power poles, street lights or traffic control devices.
