A. CALL TO ORDER

1. Community Enhancement Award

The 2019 Community Enhancement Award will be award to The Community at Marquis for their display of Tualatin Elementary School Historical Objects. Mason Hall volunteered to represent the committee at the meeting at the presentation to City Council on January 28, 2019.

2. Sagert St. Sidewalk Art Project

Committee members reviewed artwork submitted by local children for use in the Sagert St. sidewalk art project and narrowed from 37 submissions to 11 items for further consideration.

3. Art Event Update

Staff, Julie Ludemann, presented an update on the new iteration of an art event in Tualatin. In collaboration with the Diversity Taskforce, a new title for the event was created: ¡Viva Tualatin!, A Celebration of Arts & Culture. The reconfigured event will look at ways to include and celebrate historically underrepresented people, using food and art to create connections within the Tualatin Community. There will be a focus on celebration of culture through music and performance, as well as large-scale and community-created art. Artists will also be invited to show and sell their work. TAAC members also made the following suggestions: connecting with children through puppetry and storytelling, folktales, and fairytales, incorporating community partnerships with local groups such as Willowbrook and Mask & Mirror, live artist demonstrations (pottery, glassblowing), and award categories including Best in Show and People's Choice.

4. TAAC Mission & Values

Committee members reviewed draft mission statement. Dawn Upton MOTIONED that the committee accept this mission statement, Mason Hall SECONDED. Mission statement was approved by vote (5-0-0).

1. Annual Goals & Objectives

Committee members created a list of potential goals and objectives for the coming year. The discussion was tabled until next meeting (February 19, 2019).

2. TAAC Chair/Vice-Chair Elections
