Committee members and staff further discussed how the proposed works would complement the existing Visual Chronicle collection and if they are recognizable as Tualatin.

This year the visual chronicle call for artists received 10 submissions. After review of all the submissions, the following four moved on to the second round:

- Sidonie K. Caron submittal of qualifications, acrylic
- Julie Forbes submittal of qualifications, mixed media
- Ryan A. Olea Proposal for commission, watercolor and graphite pencil
- Beate Scheller Proposal for commission, copper and stone lithography

These individuals were asked to submit specific ideas through detailed narrative or sketch drawings of their proposal. The detailed proposals will be presented at the March 20 regular meeting for final selection.
