Community Arts Enhancement Commendation Nomination Form

Art Endeavor: Live concerts and Irish dancing at Winona Grange

How has it made a significant contribution to the arts in Tualatin?

Concerts, dance classes, Celtic dancing (called "ceilis", pronounced kaylees) and Irish music jam sessions are held year-round (except no concerts in summer), attracting enthusiasts from the entire metro area. Sam brings in professional musicians from all around the country as well as Ireland and the British Isles. Not all concerts are Celtic-style with occasional bluegrass/country bands for the Second Saturday concerts as well. Patrons pften bring goodies to share at intermissions, always including Anne's popular Irish soda bread. Classes attract adults but also some youth, but fewer youngsters attend since classes are held on school nights. Cailis are held on Friday evenings, sometimes with live musicians to accompany dancers. Sam and Anne also hold occasional house concerts in their Tualatin home, again with accomplished musicians and sometimes with dancing as well.

How long has art been in place or service been provided?

Sam began with concerts in 2007 and gradually expanded the repertoire of Irish cultural opportunities. Since the building opened in 1940, the wooden floor and hall at Winona Grange have historically been popular for dancing and music.

How many people have been affected by project?

Sam's concerts can draw as many as 100 each performance during the 9-month season. Dance classes attract about 30 each session.

Does it have any sustainable qualities? If so, describe.

The Tualatin performances have attracted such a following that occasionally Sam will book concerts at the Sherwood Performing Arts Center for bands that are internationally known and promise a bigger crowd. The Grange does not allow alcohol on premises which is not an issue at the Sherwood center. Two years ago he and Anne began chartering the Portland Spirit in March for Shamrock Cruises again featuring Irish music and dance performances.
