A. CALL TO ORDER

Committee Chai Buck Braden called the meeting to order at 6:33pm.

D. NEW BUSINESS

1. Equity Plan

Parks and Recreation Director Ross Hoover presented the department's draft equity plan for review and comment by the committee. The committee made several edits to the draft which will be updated and presented for review at the next meeting.

2. COVID-19 City Updates

Ross Hoover, updated the committee on Tualatin's response to the COVID-19 pandemic. City staff who are able are continuing to working from home. Those staff whose job descriptions require in-person work have modified schedules and increased sanitization protocols. Most City business is continuing as normal. Summer events are cancelled, as are many programs.

E. OLD BUSINESS

1. Art in the Right-of-Way

Staff, Julie Ludemann, updated the committee on the SW Martinazzi traffic box wrap, which is anticipated to be installed by mid-September. Committee members would like to see future projects installed throughout the City in an equitable manner. Mason Hall suggested that an arts equity plan is considered to ensure this.

2. Veterans Memorial

Ross Hoover updated the committee on the Veterans' memorial planning process. The stakeholder committee has approved the final report, which includes the Tualatin Commons as the preferred site. The report has been presented to Tualatin City Council for review.

3. Sidewalk Art

Julie Ludemann announced that the sidewalk art designs chosen by the committee will be used for future sidewalk repair projects throughout the City.

F. COMMUNICATIONS FROM COMMITTEE MEMBERS

Chair Buck Braden announced that Oregon Art Society is hosting an Art Camp for kids ages 8-15. Member Brett Hamilton reminded committee members that face coverings with exhaust ports should not be used. Council member Bridget Brooks announced that West Linn has adopted a public art ordinance and will discuss this idea at the Tualatin Council Advance.







The City of Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department is committed to creating and promoting equity and inclusion across all public art, public spaces, places, facilities and programs that the department owns or manages.

Through this Equity and Inclusion Plan and supporting action and practices, we aim to ensure that everyone, including historically marginalized minority, low-income earning, and/or limited English proficiency communities have access to the benefits of quality parks and recreation programing, facilities, parks, public spaces and natural areas.

Policy Goals

The Equity and Inclusion Plan outlines The City of Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department's approach to ensuring inclusive environments and equitable opportunities for all community members in local parks and recreation. This policy applies to all community members, staff, and sites within the City of Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department.

These policy Goals and Objectives ensure that:

- 1) Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department hires, trains and promotes its workforce equitably
 - A. Invest in continuing education and inclusive staff culture
 - B. Encourage staff to participate on the City's and Regional diversity, equity and inclusion (DEI) workgroups and teams
 - C. Strengthen the diversity of the workforce and volunteers
 - D. Build department capacity for multiple language proficiency
- 2) Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department meaningfully engages historically marginalized communities
 - A. Support and strengthen participation of all community members within engagement processes
 - B. Strengthen representation on committees by all people including those with differing abilities, race, age, culture, sexual orientation, gender identity, language, income, religion or country of origin.
 - C. Invest in equitable participation and engagement
 - D. Honor indigenous and community connection to land
- 3) Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department creates safe and welcoming services, programs, parks and public spaces.
 - A. Develop a plan to promote accessibility and eliminate physical barriers (ADA) to participation in facilities and parks
 - B. Provide equitable opportunities regardless of ability, race, age, culture, sexual orientation, gender identity, language, income, religion or country of origin.
 - C. Promote inclusivity in the operations of park and recreation facilities and public spaces
 - D. Ensure equitable prioritization, allocation and use of parks, public spaces and facilities
- 4) Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department allocates resources to advance racial equity and inclusion:
 - A. Invest in programs, parks, facilities, natural areas and open spaces equitably
 - B. Develop, maintain and monitor mechanisms that measure equitable investment
- 5) Tualatin Parks and Recreation Department consistently measures, regularly reports and continuously improves equity and inclusion practices
 - A. Establish the organizational infrastructure for management and oversight
 - B. Maintain ongoing monitoring of this plan's progress toward established goals and objectives
