#### **1. Traffic Signal Box Wrap**

The committee discussed potential locations for the next signal box art wrap. Through online polling, the committee selected the top three locations of 65<sup>th</sup> and Borland, 65<sup>th</sup> and Sagert., Boones Ferry and Sagert, and Boones Ferry and Warm Springs. After discussion, the committee decided to omit Boones Ferry and Warm Springs from consideration at this time. The committee also voted via online polling to select art for each potential location. Selected pieces included “Tualatin Cows” for the SW 65<sup>th</sup> and Borland location, and “Pumpkin Fields” for both the 65<sup>th</sup> and Sagert and Boones Ferry/Sagert locations. Julie will connect with Planning and Streets department representatives to determine final location selection. Julie will continue to research ways to solicit artists for future wrap designs.

Julie Ludemann updated the committee on the grant application.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:36 on a motion from Kathleen Silloway and seconded by Brett Hamilton.

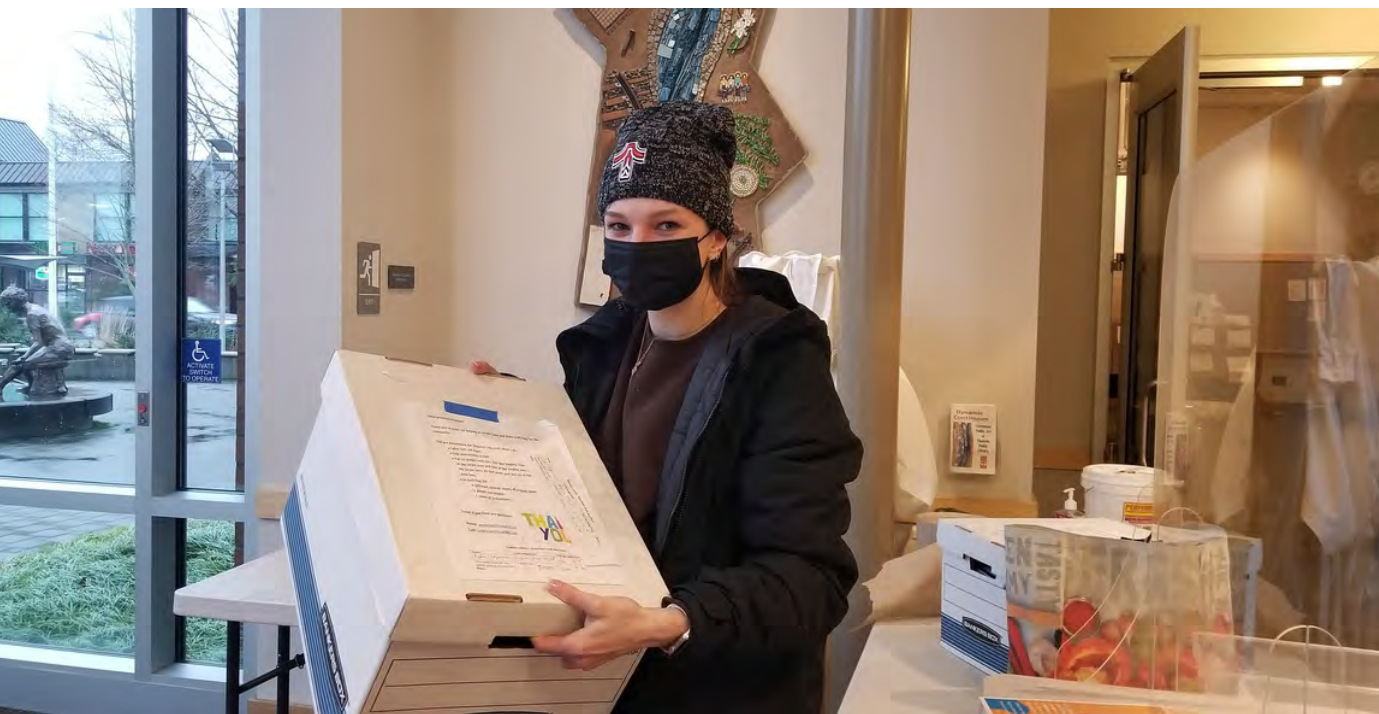

8400 hours served

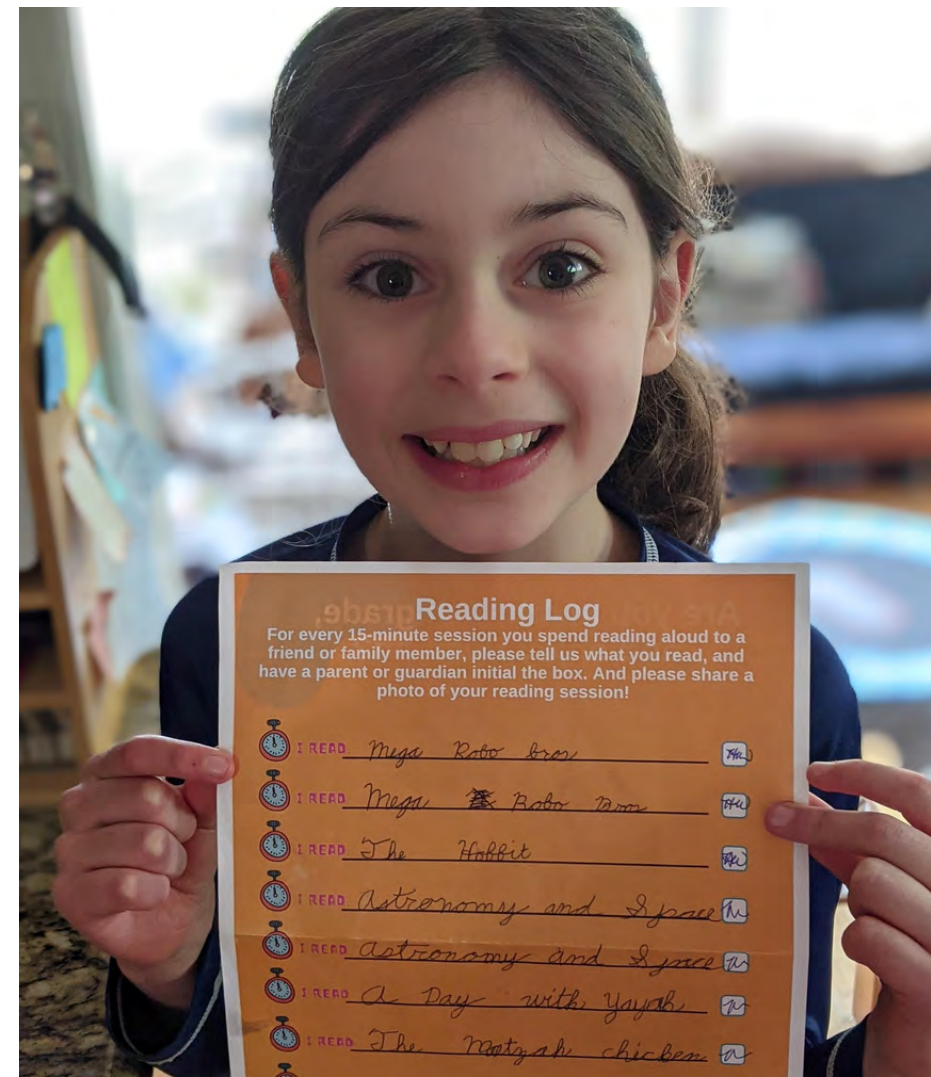
Four new programs in 2020:
