A. CALL TO ORDER

Vice Chair Brett Hamilton called the meeting to order at 6:31pm

B. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. Traffic Signal Box Wrap

Julie Ludemann presented a preliminary call to artists application for committee review. The committee discussed ideas to include in the final version. There was discussion on criteria for the subject of the art, historical information on potential sites, whether to give preference to Tualatin artists, and technical qualities for art to be wrapped on a signal box. Julie will present updated call to artists at the September meeting.

2. Basalt Creek Parks & Recreation Plan

Ross Hoover provided information on the Parks & Recreation plan for the Basalt Creek area and invited committee members to attend a focus group meeting in conjunction with Tualatin Park Advisory Committee, Planning Committee, and Youth Advisory Council on September 14th.

3. ¡Viva Tualatin!

Julie Ludemann announced that ¡Viva Tualatin! *A Celebration of Arts and Culture* would be held at Atfalati Park on August 22, the Tualatin Library on August 25, and Tualatin Community Park on August 28. Performers include Angel Ocasio, Ballet Folklorico, and Aztec Dancers. Activities include free shave ice, face painting, pinatas, and chalk art. There will be a Washington County vaccine clinic at the August 28 event.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:01 on a motion from Kathleen Silloway and seconded by Buck Braden.








