Jeannie Hart seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Brett Hamilton also asked about who should and should not contact the artists. Ross Hoover clarified that Julie Ludemann will be the only point of contact with the artists. All members of the committee indicated their understanding and approval of this.
