A. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes of the September 26, 2023 meeting were approved on a motion from Jeannie Hart and second by Mason Hall.

B. COMMUNICATIONS

- 1. Chair none
- 2. Council Liaison Councilor Bridget Brooks thanked everyone who joined the recent park tour. Councilor Brooks also provided a recap of recent City Council meetings, including Council discussion on the situation at Hazelbrook Middle School, renewal of the City's contract for Bull Run water, and announced that the City has acquired 20 new acres of parkland this year thanks to the Parks Bond. Mason Hall inquired as to the status of the City's Climate Action Plan. Councilor Brooks responded that there is a virtual open house, Julie Ludemann will send links.
- 3. Staff Julie Ludemann, Recreation Manager, announced that the West Coast Giant Pumpkin Regatta will be held on Sunday, October 22 and the Lake of the Commons. Ross Hoover, Recreation Director, thanked Jeannie Hart and Mason Hall for their participation in the parks tour.

C. NEW BUSINESS

D. OLD BUSINESS

- Community Enhancement Award Julie Ludemann reported that Angela Whratz was approved to receive a Community Enhancement Award and will be recognized at the November 13 City Council meeting. The nomination form is available on the City's website.
- 2. Outside Agency Grants Vice Chair Brett Hamilton led a discussion on the possibility of updating the Outside Agency Grant process. The committee discussed impacts of moving the grant to a point-forward process versus a retroactive grant. Kathleen Silloway commented that a point-forward grant might help broaden the applicant pool. Mason Hall commented that he didn't think a point-forward grant process would negatively impact theatre groups, and could be an incentive for new ideas. Jeannie Hart mentioned it could help offset costs for new projects. Bridget Brooks asked the committee and staff to keep in mind any reporting requirements. Ross Hoover commented that Finance rules may not allow a point-forward grant process. Jeannie Hart motioned to keep the 2023-2024 process as a retroactive

grant, to be followed by a point-forward grant for FY 2024-25, pending approval by all appropriate City entities. Kathleen Silloway seconded the motion. Motion passed with all members in agreement. Julie Ludemann reported that she will research the process and update the committee at a future meeting.

3. Veterans Plaza Service Inspired Art – Julie Ludemann updated the committee. The top three artists for the Pedestals commission have indicated interest in the project. Two of the three artists have indicated interest, and one has declined. Julie Ludemann reported that she has reached out to the next artist on the list.






