1. ***Measure 34-282 Public Information Update.***

City Manager Lombos provided Council with an update on public information for Measure 34-282. An elections calendar was shared noting staff is currently in the public education phase. Staff has been working with Barney and Worth on the public information plan. To date a website has been created for the measures, public information materials have been distributed around town, a direct mailer has gone out to registered voters, presentations to CIO's are underway, and contact with media outlets has been made.

Councilor Morrison stated he will be presenting information to the local parent teacher association at their next meeting.

Councilor Kellogg recommended staff present at one of the Chamber AM Networking's and a CERT meeting.

City Manager Lombos noted voter turnout is important. She encouraged Council to spread the word.

Councilor Bubenik stated he has been getting questions about the project list and what projects are being considered. He stated it will be important to educate the community that projects are not set in stone. City Manager Lombos stated the website is a great place to purpose a project if it is not currently on the list.

Councilor Morrison stated he will be placing yard signs on the measure this weekend. He is pleased with the City's work on the educational of the measure.

Councilor DeHaan spoke to a letter to the editor in Tualatin Life regarding Tualatin's ability to spend money wisely. He stated he feels that Tualatin does spend their money wisely and goes to great efforts to make sure of that.

Councilor Bubenik asked when ballots would be mailed in Clackamas County. City Manager Lombos stated it is the same time frame as Washington County.

Council President Davis reminded everyone extensive community input has already been received on the projects lists through study's and surveys that have been conducted in the past. She reminded everyone this measure is not just about roads, it also addresses bike and pedestrian safety. She encouraged all citizens to vote.
