EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Quarterly Land Use and Transportation Update (Purpose)

Community Development staff will provide quarterly updates to City Council on regional matters and issues happening outside of Tualatin's borders, yet impacting our local quality of life. These updates serve to (1) further understanding of the Oregon land use and transportation system, (2) provide strategic policy feedback or direction to staff, and (3) coordinate efforts between City Council, staff, and community members.

1st Quarter 2019 Update

Transportation Policy and Funding Map

Designed by Tualatin staff members Gareth Prior and Erin Engman, with feedback from regional partners, this map displays the connection between decision-making officials (left) and funding sources (right). The intent is to help translate the acronym-rich transportation world and understand the connection between Tualatin to transportation planning and funding at the state, regional, and county levels.

During the March 11th City Council work session, staff hopes to discuss how Tualatin City Council, staff, and community member efforts can align to bring needed transportation investment back to our community. The following projects will be discussed to highlight how to navigate this map:

1. 124th Avenue construction and Tualatin-Sherwood Road widening (Major Streets Transportation Improvement Program – Washington County)

2. Herman Road (Regional Flexible Funds Allocation Step 2 – Metro)
 3. Tualatin River Greenway (Connect Oregon – Oregon Transportation Commission)

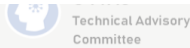
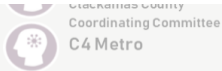
