

WEEKLY PROJECT UPDATE – JANUARY 27, 2023

Tualatin- Sherwood Rd from Teton Ave west into Sherwood	Washington County's contractor is excavating to widen and add pathways along Tualatin-Sherwood Rd from Teton Ave west into Sherwood. They have cleared the area for Roadway widening from 124 th Ave towards 115 th Ave. Contractors for utility companies (PGE, NW Natural, Comcast, etc.) are also relocating their lines to make way for the Rd construction. Traffic delays are likely. Boones Ferry Rd from Blake/Alsea to Arikara Dr	The contractor is replacing the pathway along Boones Ferry Rd from Arikara Dr to Ibach St and working along the newly-poured and reopened pathway on the west side of Boones Ferry between Sagert and Arikara; while the path has reopened, please use caution in this active construction zone. More information is at boonesferrycorridor.com. While the contractor is doing their best to get school traffic through, Expect delays between Arikara and Ibach during the day. Norwood Rd	A private developer is working to install storm drainage and water pipes under Norwood Rd to serve the first phase of the large residential Autumn Sunrise Subdivision south of Norwood Rd west of Interstate 5. Current work includes laying pipes for sanitary sewer, storm drainage, and drinking water. Vermillion St and 89th Ave will be closed periodically north of Norwood Rd and traffic on Norwood is being flagged through one lane during construction; Delays are likely.
Martinazzi Ave at Mohawk St	A contractor has poured new curb ramps and will soon be installing crosswalk lights at the intersection of Martinazzi Ave at Mohawk St, will soon be installing lights on Boones Ferry Rd at 84 th Ave. They are pouring new sidewalks, ramps, and a bus stop on Martinazzi Ave near Fred Meyer. These are part of the Neighborhood Traffic Safety portion of the Tualatin Moving Forward Program.
Blake St and Makah Ct	The contractor has completed the pipe work for the upsized sewer main under Blake St and Makah Ct east of Martinazzi Ave. The trench areas on Blake St (east of Martinazzi) and Makah Ct have been paved; the contractor is now working on final completion and cleanup.

Hazelbrook Area	Construction started this week on projects in the Hazelbrook Area (near Tualatin Rd, Jurgens Ave, and Hazelbrook Rd and School) to install flashing lights at crosswalks on Tualatin Rd (at Jurgens, Teton, and 108th), Restripe Hazelbrook Rd and Jurgens Ave to add bike lanes, make pedestrian improvements at the Hazelbrook/Jurgens intersection, and add a crosswalk across Jurgens Ave between Wasco and Kiowa Sts this winter/spring.
Herman Rd	The private developer building new industrial buildings along Herman Rd (between Tualatin Rd and Teton Ave) will be working in Herman Rd to install new water connections for the new buildings. Two-way traffic will be in a single lane controlled by flaggers; Expect delays on Herman between Teton and Tualatin Rd for the next few weeks. The City is now seeking construction bids to widen and reconstruct Herman Rd from Tualatin Rd to Teton Ave. Bids are due February 14th, with construction planned from March through October.
65 th Ave near Meridian Hospital	Construction is planned to start February 6 to add a crosswalk with flashing lights across 65th Ave near Meridian Park Hospital.
Nyberg St and 65 th Ave	A private developer is building the Tualatin River Trail connection behind the new apartment complex on the old RV Park property along Nyberg Lane near its intersection with Nyberg St and 65th Ave . The trail is closed at the Nyberg Woods (Best Buy) connection on the west and Browns Ferry Park on the east while this connection is being made. They will be paving some of Nyberg Lane in front of their development in the next few weeks; expect delays during paving.
Ride Connection	Ride Connection has opened the new Green Line of the Tualatin Shuttle providing small bus service from the Bridgeport Park-and-Ride through Downtown Tualatin (and the WES Station) and out Borland Rd to the social services at Rolling Hills Church on Borland near Stafford Rd.
