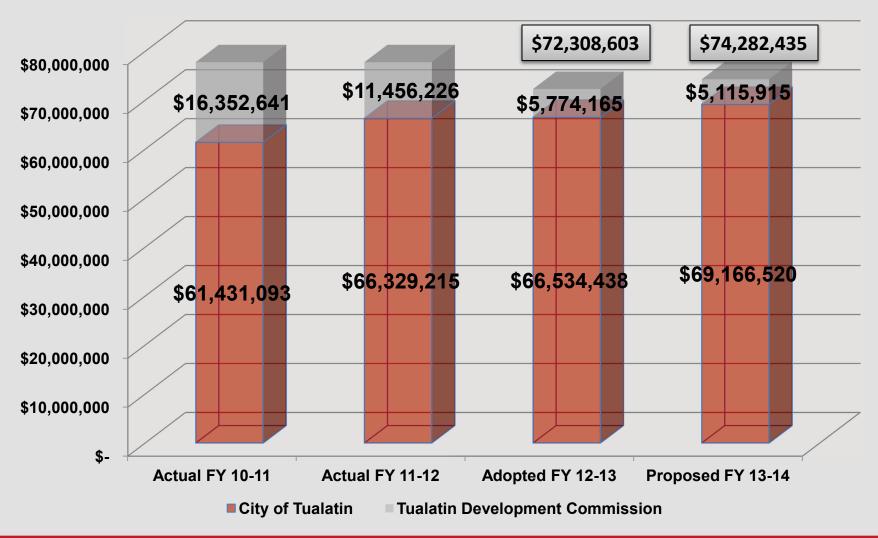




City Hall, Tualatin, Oregon. July 12 1923. Budget Committee called to order by Mayor Nyberg. J.H.Schamoni was elected chairman and E.A.Robinson was elected secretary. Moved and seconded that meeting be adjourned until July 23 1923. in order to give city recorder time to prepare statistics on expenditures for the three years just preceding. Carried. City Hall, Tualatin, Oregon. July 23 1923. Meeting called to order by Chairman Schamoni. Minutes of previous meeting were read and appreved. Record of 1922 Budget Committee read by city recorder. Moved and seconded that record be approved. Carried. City recorder read list of expenditures for three preceding years. Estimated expenditures for 1924: Lights Elections 40 Fuel 15 Miscellaneous 100 520 Moved and seconded that the estimate be approved. Carried. Moved and seconded that last year's levy plus 6% be made.Carried. Estmate for Special Tax: Prison Cell Stove Window Shades 7.50 Window Screens 7.50 Cleaning and grading City Lot 150 Sidewalks 100 500.00 Moved and seconded that estimate for special tax be approved. Carried. Minutes of this meeting were read and approved. Moved and seconded meeting be adjourned. Carried.

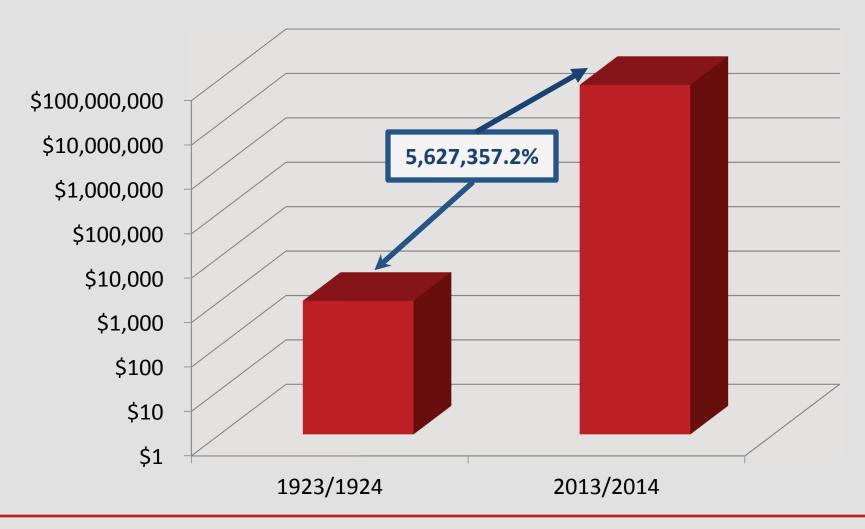


City and TDC Budgets





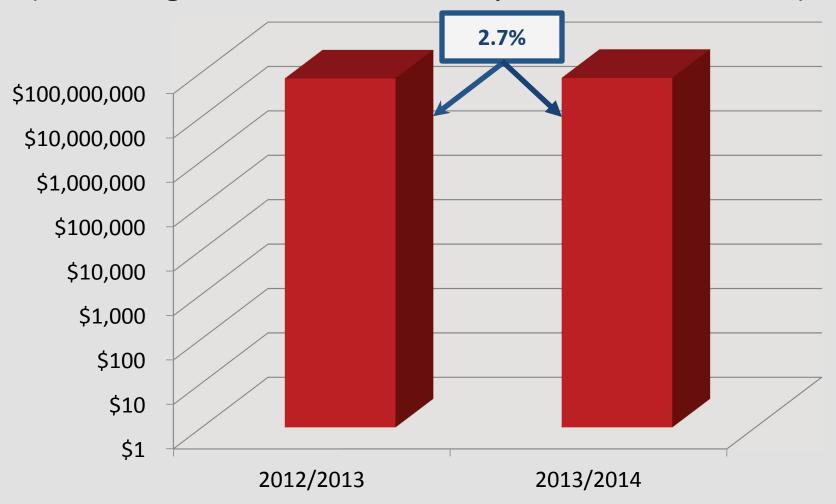
Change in City's Budget

(Including the Tualatin Development Commission)



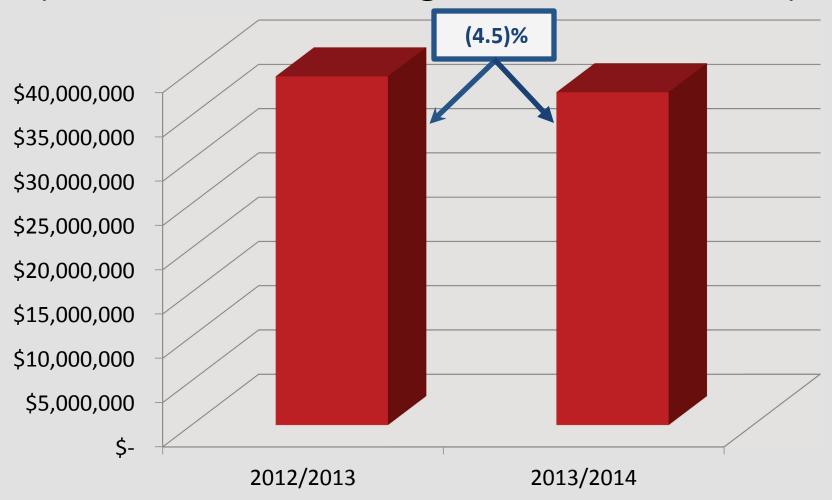






Total Expenditures

(Less Reserves, Contingencies and Transfers)







































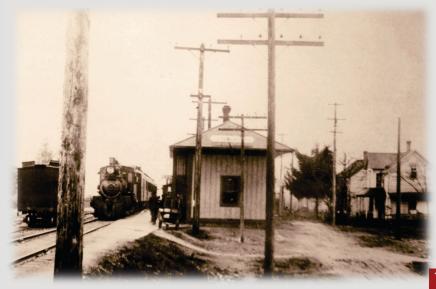


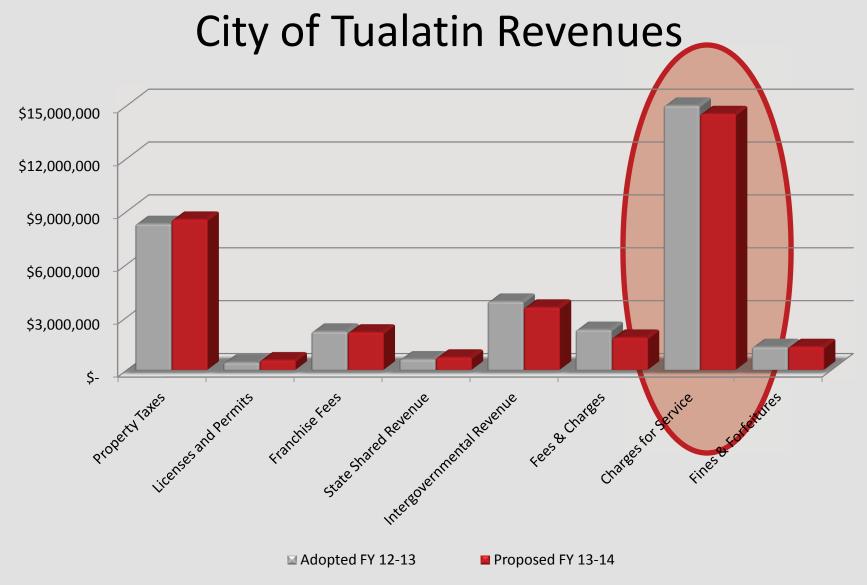






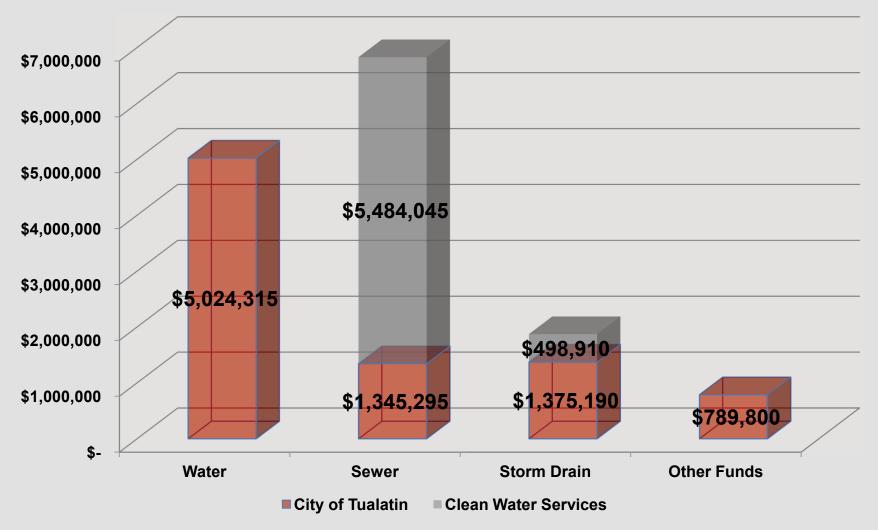






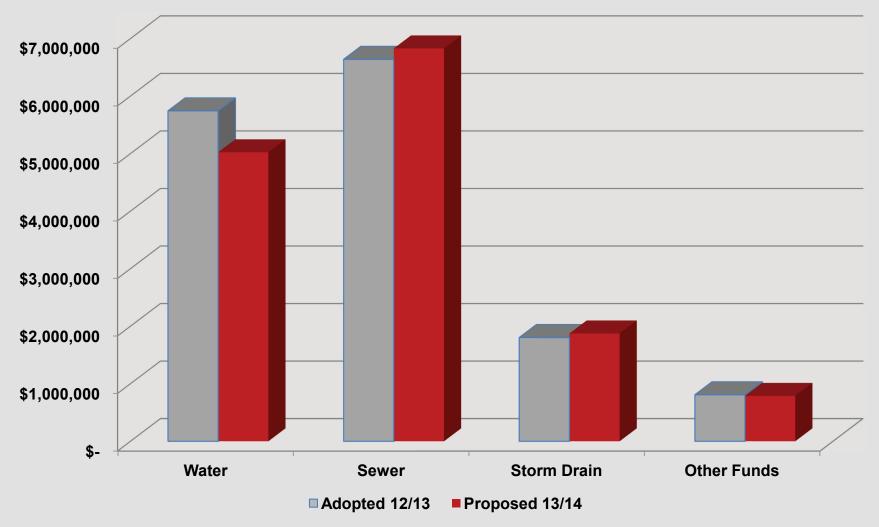

 - Limit growth in materials and services







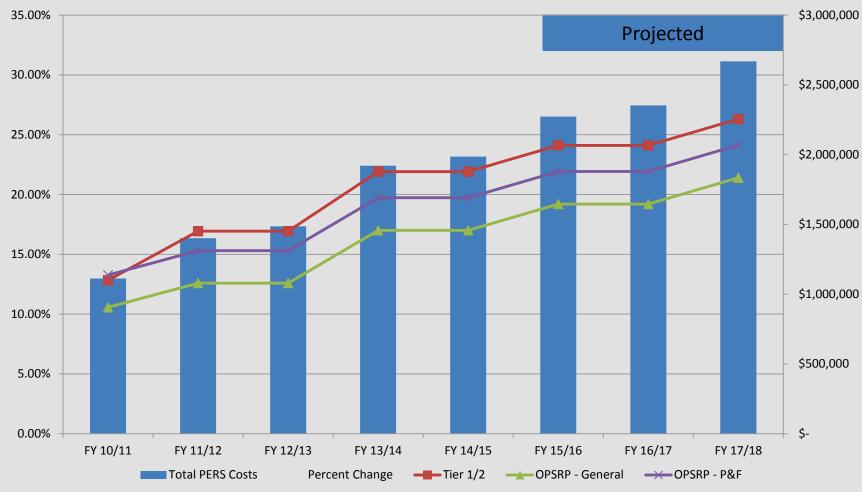
PERS

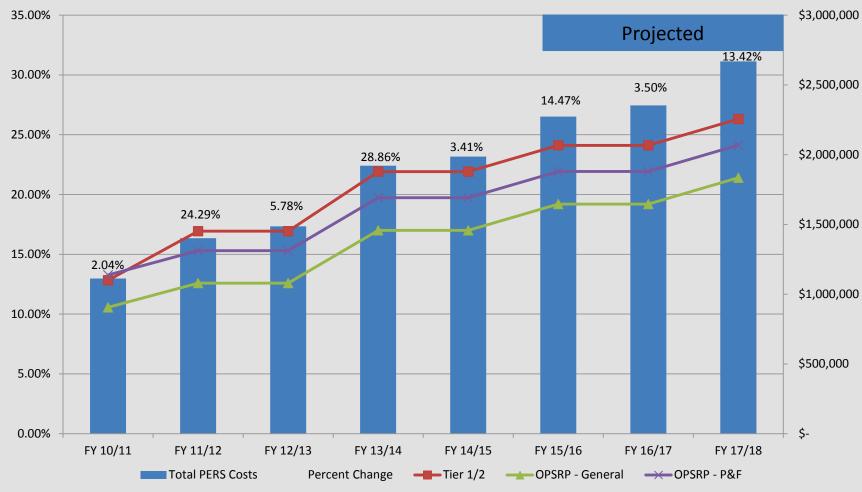
- Second largest single expenditure in General Fund -\$1.9 million in FY 13/14
- "Rate Collar"
 - Adopted by PERS Board in 2005
 - PERS Board adjusted collar in Jan. 2010 to limit increases associated with 2008 investment losses
 - Collared contribution rate increases for the three biennia beginning on July 1, 2011
 - 4% for 2011-2013 Tualatin 4.10% and 2.03%
 - 5% for 2013-2015 Tualatin 4.98% and 4.41%
 - 2% for 2015-2017







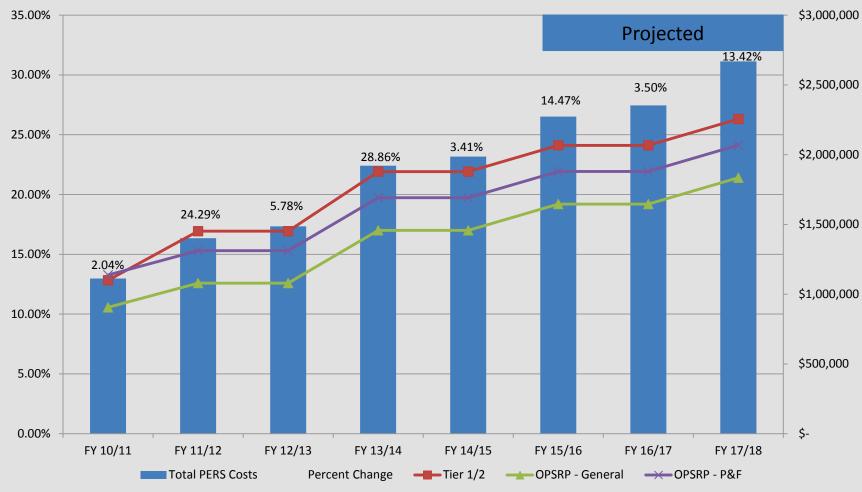




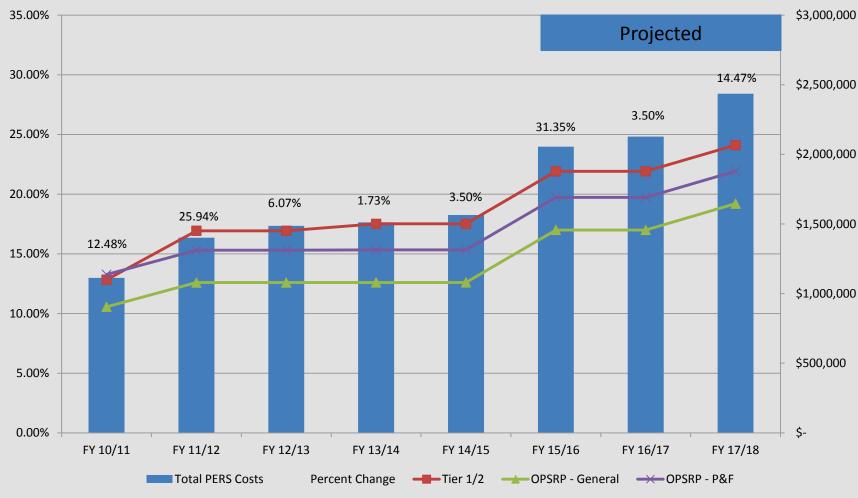
PERS Legislation

- Over 30 bills in current Legislative Session
- SB 822
 - Signed by Governor Kitzhaber last week
 - Changes to COLA and out of state tax benefit
 - Conflicting legal opinions
 - Directs PERS Board to defer 1.9% of payroll of scheduled July 2013 rate increase to 15/17
 - Increases contribution rate in future biennia by about 0.3% of payroll
 - Reduce 13/15 rates up to 4.4%
 - Spreads current increases into future bienna

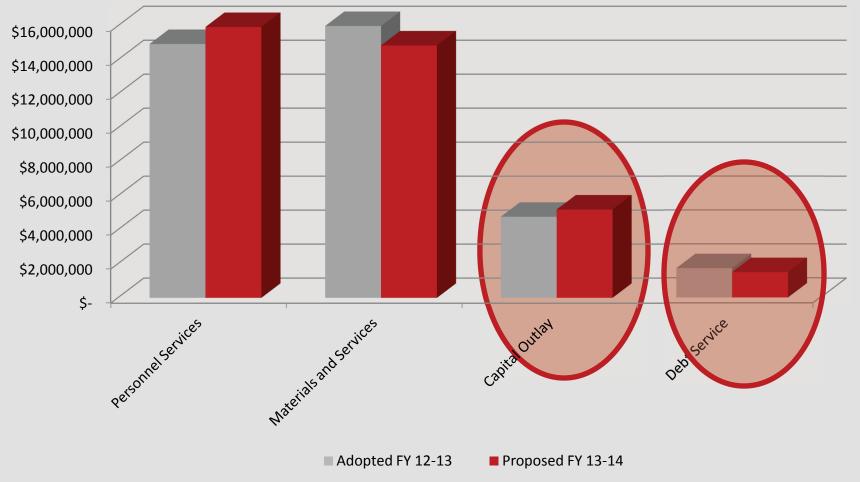




PERS - Tualatin Impact (with Reform)

 - > Fund prioritized one-time expenditures



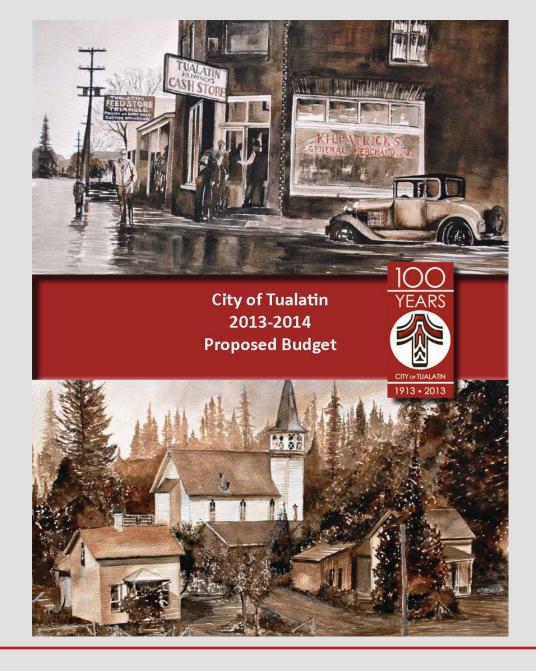




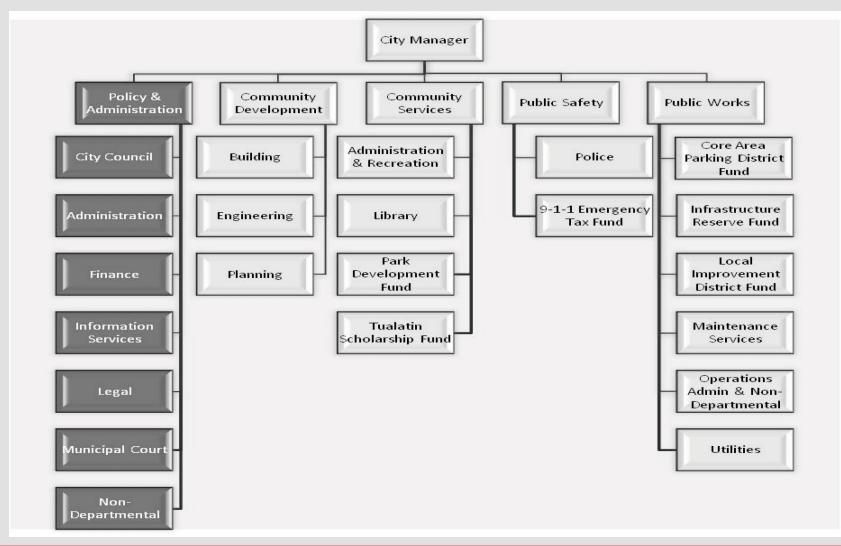


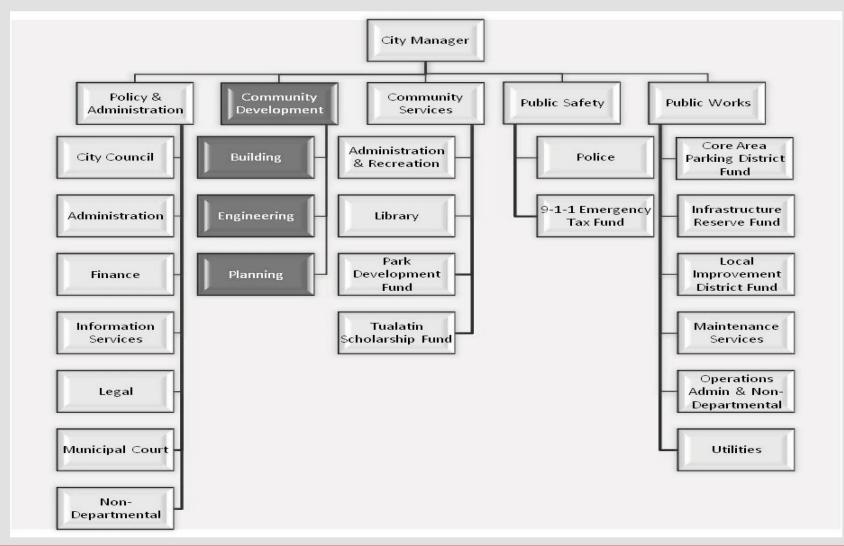
Distribution of Proposed FY 2013 - 14 Budget Document

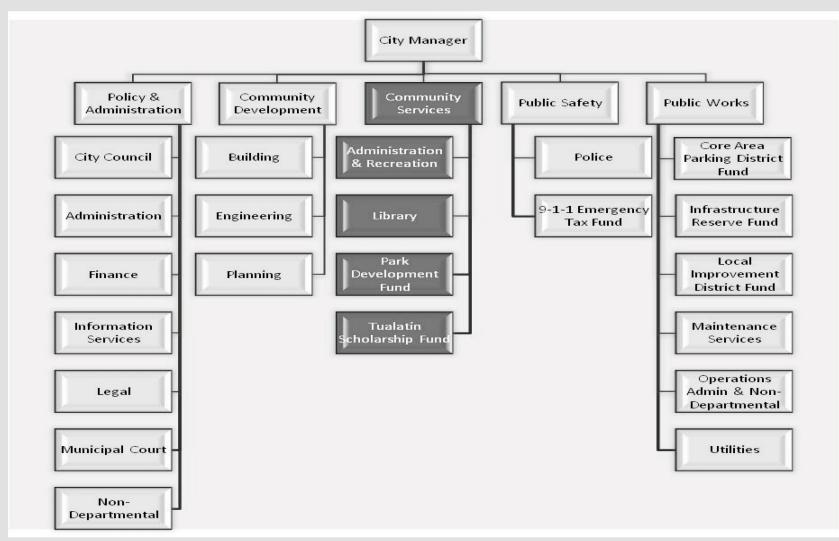


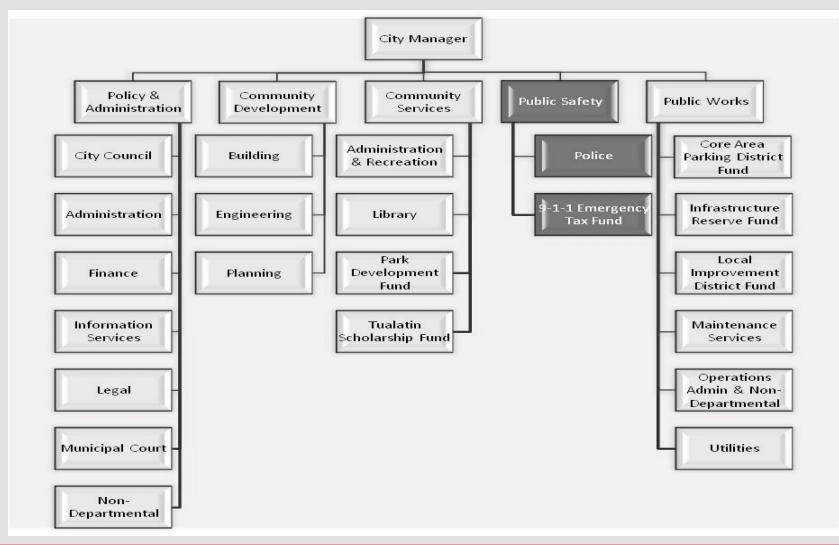


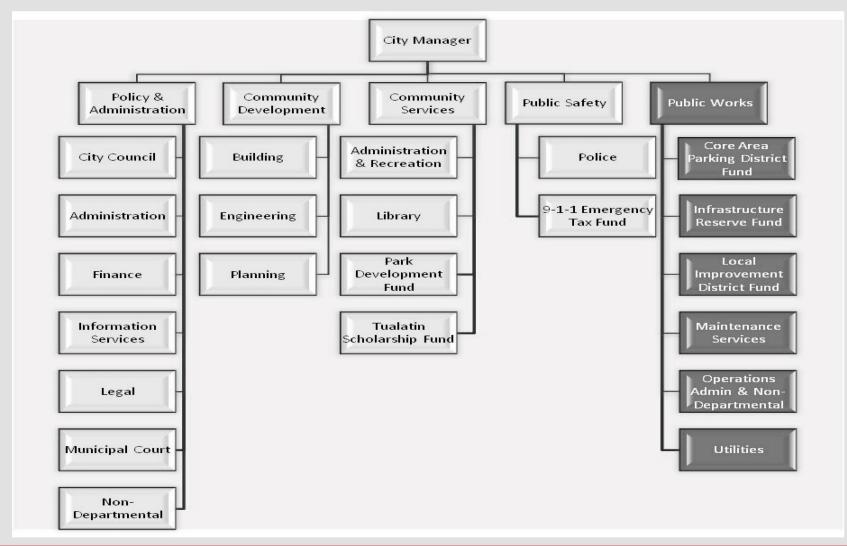
