

## Summer Reading 2016

This year we are **challenging the community to read 50,000 hours**. All ages can help us achieve this goal by signing up for Summer Reading and recording and returning your reading logs. Here's how to participate:

1. Sign up for Summer Reading between June 1 and July 31 and pick up your reading record.

2. Choose your reading level:

**Pre-Readers** are infants, toddlers, preschoolers, etc. Count the minutes spent reading to these children.

Each sticker = 15 minutes

**Rookie Readers** are children, teens, or adults who are learning to read, or starting a new reading habit.

Each sticker = 15 minutes

**All Star Readers** are children, teens, or adults who read independently and confidently.

Each sticker = 30 minutes

3. Read and record your minutes with a sticker. Each time you read for the suggested number of minutes put a sticker in a circle on your reading record. You can mark more than one circle per day.

4. When you have marked every circle, return your reading record to the library between July 1 and August 31 to claim your prizes. You'll also get an entry into our Grand Prize drawings.

5. Keep reading. Get an extra log and start all over again for more entries into the Grand Prize drawings.

6. Our "Read Harder" genre challenge for teens will qualify entry into a drawing for a \$100 gift card prize. Adults who read 100 hours will also be entered into a separate drawing for a \$100 gift card.

7. Adults, write a review of what you are reading. Visit [reads.wccls.org/more](http://reads.wccls.org/more) or pick up a paper form in the library to submit your review and be entered for even more prizes!
