A. Call to Order

Vice Chair, Brandon Gill called the meeting to order at 6:02 pm.

B. Approval of Minutes

The minutes of June 8, 2021 meeting was unanimously approved on a motion by Josh Huffman, and second from Anthony Warren.

D. Old Business

1. Park Funding Update

The park utility fee began July 1, with bills going out at the end of the month. Ross Hoover reviewed the latest version of the prioritization criteria to score park assets. Committee members discussed the categories and rating range. Josh Huffman made a motion to use the asset scoring, and Emma Gray seconded. After discussion, four members were supportive, one opposed with one abstaining. The subjective nature of the scoring matrix was mentioned. Staff indicated that they would like to revisit the scoring criteria after committee members provided additional input.

2. Acknowledgement of Native Land and People Beth Dittman reported that a citywide committee is in the process of forming with representatives from organizations, tribe and advisory committees. This work group is expected to meet soon.

3. Basalt Creek Parks & Recreation Plan Rich Mueller and Ross Hoover shared the presentation to Council during the work session on July 26. This presentation incudes: master plan guidance, plan purpose & background, tasks completed, map of planning area, next steps, potential funding, and final outcome.

There was also discussion regarding in person public meetings having a virtual option.

System Balance	Increases equity, access, or geographic distribution of recreation opportunities (e.g., meets an unmet need, addresses a gap in services, serves an underserved group or area).	
Urgency/ Immediacy	Meets health and safety/regulatory elements; action must be taken now before the opportunity is lost; completion is needed before another priority project can be started.	
Ease of Implementation	Can be easily attained or accomplished; uses existing site; necessary planning, feasibility studies, and permitting have already been completed.	
Synergistic	Project provides opportunity to enhance other projects or to leverage other funds to complete.	
Environmental Sustainability	Project provides reduces impact or provides more efficient products or operations.	
Operational Sustainability	Increases sustainability, reduces costs, increases maintenance and operational efficiencies, and/or increases facility revenues.












Q5: In general, I attend this number of programsper month:






