A. Call to Order

Chair Emma Gray called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

- 1. Roll Call was taken with six members present and one members absent.
- 2. Emma Gray led the group through introductions and welcoming new member Carl Hosticka.
- Election of Officers was held by paper ballots distributed by Rich Mueller. Rich announced the unanimous election of Emma Gray as Chair and Beth Dittman as Vice Chair.

D. Old Business

1. Annual Report Council Presentation

Emma Gray gave a brief synopsis of the annual report given at the March 13 City Council Meeting. Emma reported City Councilors are supportive of the work TPARK is doing.

- 2. Arbor Month
 - a. TPARK Presentation April 10 Emma Gray led members though the presentation slides and asked for input, questions and suggestions. A suggestion was made by Anthony Warren to add "aesthetically pleasing" to the list of benefits of trees.
 - b. Photo and Poster Contest Jugging Heidi Marx facilitated the selection process to choose winners of the children's poster contest and adult photography contest. Photography slides where shown and paper ballots were used to vote for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in the photo contest. Committee members then viewed the children's artwork posted around the room and selected winners from each category. Emma Gray asked for clarification on how the youth winners would be recognized during the City Council meeting and Heidi indicated that the committee provides the presentation and mayor presents poster contest winners.

3. Parks Bond Update

Rich Mueller summarized the draft of the bond project schedule and how the projects are broken down into two phases. Ross Hoover shared the processed used to select the bond projects. Ross then provided criteria that was used to determine the timing of the projects on the schedule. Ross reported on the bond sales process and the plans for each phase. Members of TPARK continued discussion on the different park funding methods available. Beth Dittman inquired about public bond communications, Ross indicated a plan is in the works. Michael Klein expressed a concern about project timeline and cost escalation. Both Rich and Ross addressed the concern.

Emma Gray gave an update and overview of committee goals. Emma indicated the following goals have been achieved; Advocate for once-per-quarter in-person meetings and connect with Equity Committee Planning Group. Emma then shared plans to meet future committee goals. Carl Hosticka inquired about Tualatin's tree code and Ross shared information regarding tree code updates as part of the City climate plan.

2. Veterans Plaza Service Inspired Art Selection Committee

Rich Mueller requested that a representative of TPARK serve on the Veterans Plaza Service Inspired Art Selection Committee. Rich recapped the previous planning processes for the Veterans Plaza, and community desire for what, who and how the space will honor veterans. Members were asked to consider participating and let staff know by Friday March 17 of their interest.
