- Includes actions that the community, City staff, and City Council can take to help people adapt to changing climate conditions (adaptation) and to reduce carbon emissions (mitigation)




### How Tualatin's climate will change







More days over 95 degrees F






FIGURE 7: Recent fire conditions around Tualatin




FIGURE 24: Tualatin's emissions sources


