House Concurrent Resolution 19

Sponsored by Representative PARRISH, Senator DEVLIN

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Commemorates 100th anniversary of founding of City of Tualatin.

2	Whereas Native Americans have resided in the Tualatin River Basin, home to the Atfalati Tribe
3	for thousands of years; and
4	Whereas on September 27, 1850, the Congress of the United States passed the Donation Land
5	Claim Act whereby United States citizens could earn land title through cultivation of the land, and
6	between 1850 and 1853 some 30 families settled in the Tualatin River Basin area; and
7	Whereas the first town plat was drawn in 1887 around a new railroad line, and the settlement
8	was named Tualatin; and
9	Whereas the City of Tualatin was incorporated in 1913; and
10	Whereas the City of Tualatin has grown in population from approximately 150 residents at the
11	time of incorporation to 26,120 in its centennial year; and
12	Whereas the City of Tualatin has grown to become a community of engaged citizens, with a di-
13	verse and robust economy, beautiful parks and natural areas and a high quality of life for its resi-
14	dents; and
15	Whereas residents of the City of Tualatin are urged to learn more about the city's past, to make
16	positive contributions in the present and to help leave a healthy legacy for the city's future; and
17	Whereas the City of Tualatin, Mayor Lou Ogden, City Council President Monique Beikman
18	Councilors Wade Brooksby, Frank Bubenik, Joelle Davis, Nancy Grimes and Ed Truax and the
19	Tualatin Chamber of Commerce encourage all Oregon residents to participate in the City of
20	Tualatin's Centennial Celebration, a year-long array of programs and activities to recognize the
21	city's 100th anniversary; now, therefore,
22	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
23	That we, the members of the Seventy-seventh Legislative Assembly, commemorate the occasion
24	of the 100th anniversary of the founding of the City of Tualatin and extend our gratitude and best
