## TUALATIN MOVING FORWARD: BOND PROGRAM SEES CONTINUED MOMENTUM

The Transportation bond program Tualatin Moving Forward has seen continued momentum so far in 2019. To date, the program has constructed and built 5 projects. The most recently completed project was the Boones and Siletz intersection. That project greatly improved pedestrian safety at the crosswalk and installed driver feedback signs to reduce speeding through the intersection. One of the program's signature projects, Garden Corner Curves, held an open house in June that closed down the street and allowed residents to walk through the corridor and visualize the proposed improvement. Construction is anticipated to begin early next year.

## TUALATIN SERVICE CENTER

The City of Tualatin is moving forward with plans to construct a new building – the Tualatin Service Center-located at the current public works facility site. This \$8 million project will consolidate a number of functions including building, planning, and engineering into a one-stop-shop permit counter that will be readily accessible to our community. The project has incorporated feedback from the public as well as employees on how to best utilize space. The City hired Scott Edwards Architecture to manage the design process and Bremik for the management of the construction process. The City is currently going through the permitting process and anticipates construction to start in early 2020 with completion of the new building in the Fall of 2020.



## BASALT CREEK PARKWAY EXTENSION

Last summer, Washington County hosted an open house to review the proposed plans for the Basalt Creek Parkway Extension. The open house presented three alternatives for the design of the program.

Basalt Creek Parkway, including the extension, will be a five-lane arterial with bicycle and pedestrian facilities, drainage and street lighting. The project includes a bridge across Tapman Creek and a new signalized intersection at Boones Ferry Road.

This is a \$31 million project that is anticipated to be completed by 2023.
