CANCELLATIONS

Programs are subject to cancellation due to weather, low enrollment, or other reasons outside of our control. If you are enrolled in a program that cancels, you will be notified and receive a full refund.

REFUNDS

It is our policy to refund 100% of program fees if your withdrawal notice is given seven or more days before the start date of the program. A 50% refund will be given if withdrawal notice is given less than seven days before the start date of a program. Program fees are not refunded for withdrawals less than 24 hours before the start of a program.

NEIGHBORHOOD AND PEDESTRIAN SAFETY PROJECTS MOVE FORWARD

The City of Tualatin ended 2018 with the completion of several transportation projects and kicked off 2019 looking to move forward with several more through the Tualatin Moving Forward program. This program encompasses the \$20 million in congestion relief and traffic safety improvements approved by Tualatin voters in May 2018.

In December, two new crosswalks were installed with pedestrian activated flashing lights that will help improve safety. One of the new crosswalks is located at Sagert & Womponoag, providing new safe access to Atfalati Park. The other is on Ibach St, providing safe access to Ibach Park.

In 2019, several more projects will be underway- including intersection improvements at Siletz & Boones Ferry.

CITY OF TUALATIN OPENS LOU OGDEN BRIDGE

The Lou Ogden Bridge (SW Myslonny Street over Hedges Creek) opened to traffic the first week of December 2018, providing an important connection between Tualatin Sherwood Road and Herman Road in the heart of the industrial center of Tualatin. Named after longtime Tualatin Mayor, Lou Ogden, the three-lane bridge spans 68 feet and includes bicycle lanes and sidewalks on both sides. The \$2.9 million project started construction in May of 2018 and was paid for with a mix of revenue from Traffic Impact Fees and Transportation Development Taxes.

"This is an exciting project that will really encourage economic growth by making it easier for businesses to deliver goods to market and hopefully reduce congestion for residents in Tualatin", said Public Works Director, Jeff Fuchs.

A grand opening and dedication ceremony was held on December 20th 2018 to commemorate the Mayor and his service to our community.
