OFFICERS TO ISSUE "TICKETS" FOR GOOD DEEDS

Youngsters 'caught in the act' will cool off with a Slurpee® beverage

School is almost out for the summer and kids in Tualatin may actually look forward to their next encounter with the "heat", thanks to 7-Eleven® stores' popular Operation Chill® program that rewards positive behavior with a very cool treat.

Through Operation Chill®, Tualatin Police officers can "ticket" youngsters caught in the act of doing good with Slurpee® beverage coupons.
