



TriMet Payroll Tax




- 10 year phase-in





Tualatin Shuttle

- A fare-free, deviated fixed route service linking Tualatin WES to employment destinations in the Tualatin area. Specifically designed for transit-dependent employees, job-seekers, and low-income individuals.



Tualatin Shuttle

2015

- Redesigned in May to be fixed route, but accommodate off-route requests.
- 23,348 total rides
- Average of 91.6 boardings per weekday

2016

- Outreach and route redesign will take place Spring/Summer 2016 to expand total transit coverage in Tualatin.
















Preferred Land Use Scenario










